### **Kenny Evans Awarded Student Advocate of the Year**

Associated Students Inc. (ASI) congratulates Senator Kenny Evans for receiving the California State Student Association (CSSA) 2005-06 Student Advocate of the Year award at the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual California Higher Education Student Summit (CHESS) in Sacramento.

Evans was selected from more than 46 board members from all 23 CSU campuses for his dedication, hard work, and commendable involvement with CSSA. On top of his duties as Financial Aid Officer for the CSSA, and ASI Senator, Evans was appointed by the state to sit on several advisory committees within the California Student Aid Commission.
