### **Association of College Unions International (ACUI) Region 15 Conference, to be hosted by ASI**

The Association of College Unions International (ACUI) Region 15 announces its 2004 Conference, Adding-On to the House, November 4, 5, & 6. This 3-day annual conference will bring nearly 40 member colleges and universities from Hawaii, Nevada, California, Guam and Australia together to facilitate community building and information exchange. This year, Cal Poly Pomona's Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) has the honor of hosting the conference which will be held at the DoubleTree Hotel in Ontario and the Bronco Student Center.

Features of the conference will include

- Hands-on educational sessions about important facility management issues
- Student leadership sessions for both student leaders and student staff
- More than 50 educational sessions for student union and student activities professionals
- Two nationally known keynote speakers - Elizabeth Birch, former Executive Director of the Human Rights Campaign and Marsha Herman-Betzen, Executive Director of ACUI
- Opportunity to meet and network with nearly 250 students and staff from other colleges/universities

All Cal Poly Pomona students, faculty and staff are invited to attend at the ACUI member rate. Cost for the full three-day conference for ACUI institutional members is \$250, which covers all expenses during the conference except lodging, travel and any meals not listed.
