The 2005 Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) Student Government Election Results Are In!

2004-05 ASI Attorney General, Charles Gruver, is the newly elected ASI President. He will lead the ASI Executive Board for the 2005-2006 school year with running mate and Vice-President-Elect Aileen Orfino. The 2005 ASI Elections took place May 17, 18 and 19 with a record 2,391 ballots cast over the three-day voting period.

Cal Poly Pomona students who voted were automatically entered into an opportunity drawing for a chance to win free parking for one quarter. Winners of this year's drawing were Tim Cortez, Leonel Juarez, and Carol Sam.
